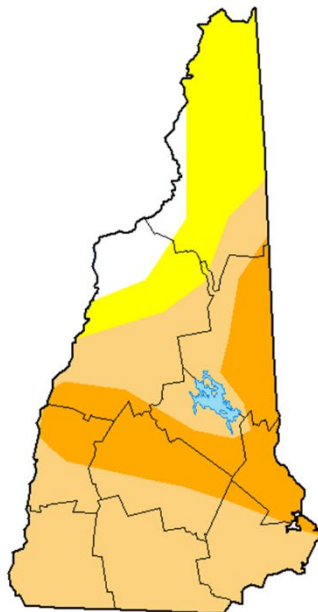
Weather Trends/Outlook

April rainfall was less than average (2.1 inches compared to an average of 2.9 inches) and long-term precipitation has been below average every month since June 2025 and Moderate to Severe Drought conditions persist in the region (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).







There are no water use restrictions currently in place for Abenaki's customers yet residents are encouraged to use water conservatively. Less demand over the winter will help local aquifers recharge thereby lowering the probability of water use restrictions later this spring and summer.
