




## Water Supply Update

### Serving the Communities of Millbury and Oxford


#### Weather Trends/Outlook

Precipitation totaled 12.3 inches in July. This amount was significantly more than the long-term average of 4.60 inches. This is consistent with the data from the last twelve months as Millbury/Oxford has seen more precipitation than an average year for this region. Millbury and Oxford are currently at Drought Level 0 – Normal.
