


# Water Supply Update

Serving the Communities of Hampton, North Hampton, & Rye

## Weather Trends/Outlook

Precipitation in May totaled 2.3 inches compared to the long term average of 4.2 inches. Over the past 12 months, total precipitation is 0.2 inches below average. Average monthly temperature was 58°F, which is 3°F above the historical average.

## Current Water Use Restrictions

There was light precipitation over the second half of May, and the U.S. Drought Monitor (<https://droughtmonitor.unl.edu>) currently shows Abnormally Dry conditions in parts of southern New Hampshire.

However, this does not extend to the seacoast and there are no current water use restrictions.
