
## Water Supply Update

## Weather Trends/Outlook

The Seacoast remains in an Abnormally Dry condition. Although 4.0 inches of rainfall fell in May, 2.7 inches fell over the Memorial Day weekend. May was dryer than the average of 4.2 inches. The rainfall deficit is 1.0 inches over the past year.

The U.S. Drought Monitor (<a href="https://droughtmonitor.unl.edu">https://droughtmonitor.unl.edu</a>) currently shows that drought conditions continue to be **Abnormally Dry** on the New Hampshire seacoast.



## **Current Water Use Restrictions**

Currently, there are no water use restrictions, however, Abnormally Dry conditions persist. Residents and businesses are encouraged to practice efficient outside water use, especially for lawn sprinklers, which should not be done more than twice per week.
