

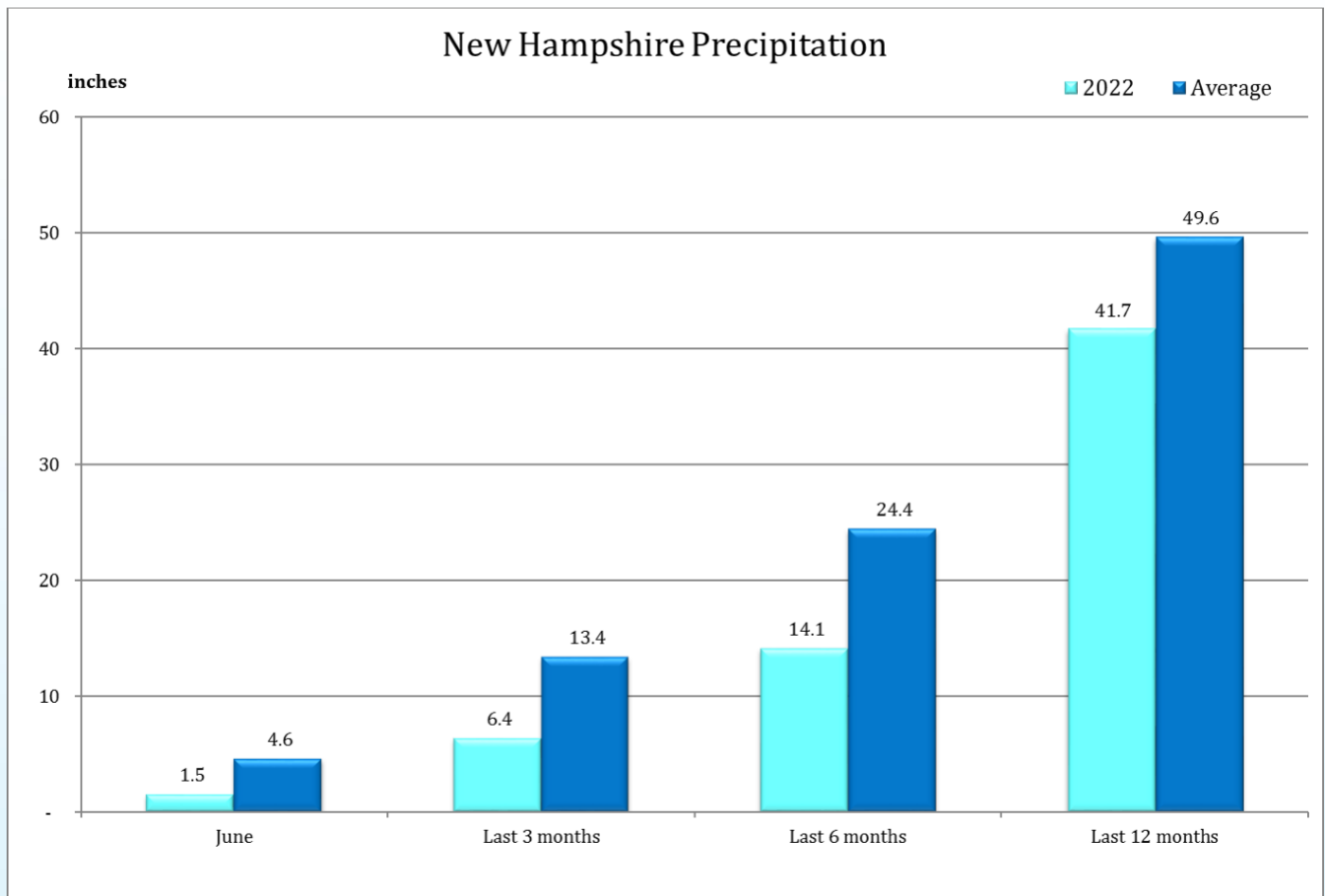


## Water Supply Update

June was dryer than average. 1.5 inches of precipitation fell on the Seacoast; only a third of the monthly average of 4.6 inches.

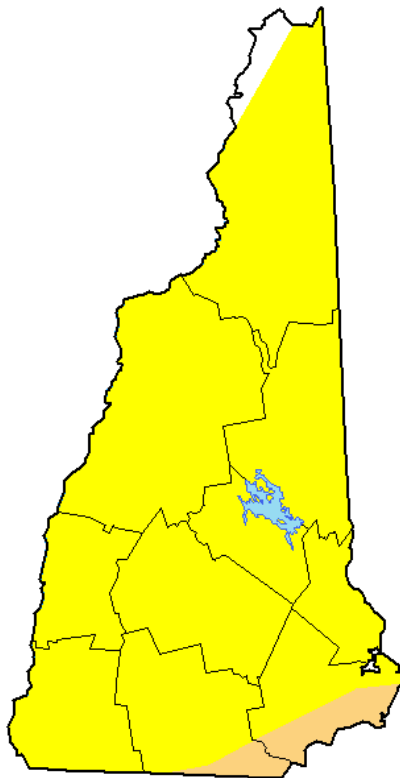










The U.S. Drought Monitor (<https://droughtmonitor.unl.edu>) currently shows moderate drought conditions across the New Hampshire seacoast.
