


Water Supply Update

Serving the Communities of Hampton, North Hampton, Rye & Stratham Weather Trends/Outlook

Precipitation totaled 3.9 inches in October. This is less than the long-term average of 5.2 inches, and lower than average precipitation levels persist over the last year. The U.S. Drought Monitor map continues to shows an improvement to abnormally dry conditions across the New Hampshire seacoast.




