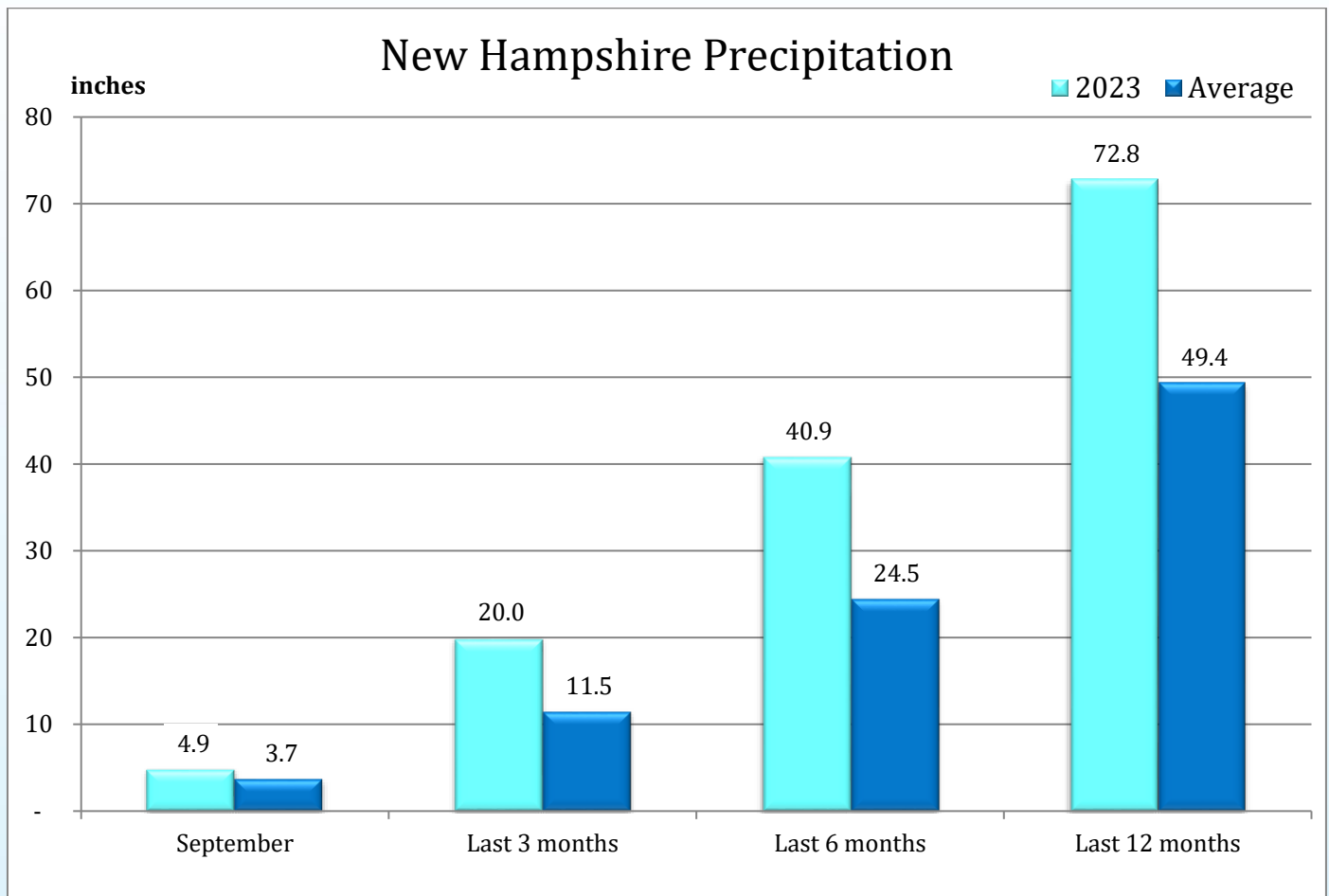


## Water Supply Update

### Weather Trends/Outlook

September was another wetter than average month with rainfall of 4.9 inches, more than the long-term average of 3.7 inches. Higher than average precipitation over the past year has alleviated drought conditions. The U.S. Drought Monitor map shows no dry or drought conditions currently in any of Aquarion’s service areas.









**U.S. Drought Monitor
